One Answer: His Name Is Jesus by Emily Moore

John 3 gives the story of Nicodemus, a Pharisee, a deeply respected and highly educated ruler of the Jews. Nicodemus had heard the rumors of Jesus, and he had questions concerning this rural prophet. He knew he needed to speak with Jesus directly to get the answers he desired, however, having a meeting with Jesus would be discouraged by the other Pharisees. He found himself in a conundrum. I imagine he had several sleepless nights before he came up with his midnight plan. Off Nicodemus went, under the cloak of darkness to meet with Jesus. Nicodemus, a teacher, brought his questions to Jesus, the rabbi. Jesus received him gladly and explained to Nicodemus the need to be born a second time — born of the Spirit. Nicodemus first thought he meant a literal second birth and was obviously confused. He left the conversation and from all accounts did not fully believe Jesus' words, and yet at some point Nicodemus seemed to be persuaded. Three years later, at the time of the crucifixion, Nicodemus entered the story again. He assisted Joseph of Arimathea, wrapping Jesus' body for burial and placing his body in the tomb. Nicodemus, a religious leader, touched a dead body, just before Sabbath! Nicodemus, respected, educated, with his questions, came first by night and then received Jesus' words, "You must be born again."

The very next chapter is the story of the woman at the well. It is fascinating to compare and contrast these two stories! John purposefully presents the two stories side-by-side. The woman is given no name. She was a Samaritan, disliked by the Jews, uneducated. She was not looking for Jesus, only looking for water. She came to the well at noon, choosing a time when the other ladies have already had social hour and gone back in their homes. She wanted to be alone. Jesus initiated the conversation with her as he sat resting by the well. Like Nicodemus, she had questions for Jesus, "Why are you speaking to me, a Samaritan?" Jesus explained that if she only knew the gift and the One who was asking, she would ask Him for living water. She took him literally at first (like Nicodemus) and then continued the conversation. Jesus explained that whoever received living water would never be thirsty again. Greedily, she responded, "Give it to me!"

Before granting her request, Jesus asked her to go get her husband and she replied she didn't have a husband. Jesus responded that he knew her story and knew she had lived with five husbands and was now living with a man who was not her husband. Before living water is given, Jesus requires transparency with Himself. She later spoke, "I know the Messiah is coming and when He comes, He will explain it all." Jesus responded, "I who speak to you, Am."

A nameless woman, uneducated, despised by the Jews, a sinner, slipping to the well at noon to not be seen by others and hearing the words "I am." The very first one that Jesus declared His identity to as the Messiah was this woman!

Nicodemus and the woman, seemingly two opposites, yet One Jesus. One man, One woman. One Jew, One Samaritan. One respected, One despised. Both with questions. Both needing to be born again. Both needing to be born of the Spirit of God. Both needing the Messiah. Both loved by the Messiah.

Friends, you may relate more to one or the other, but no matter where you find yourself the answer is the same. Jesus. Jesus is the answer for all of us. We must be born again of the Spirit. 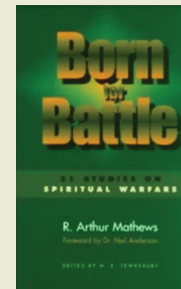

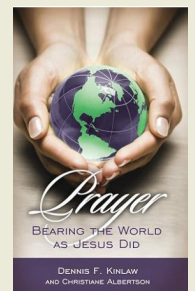
Spring Reading

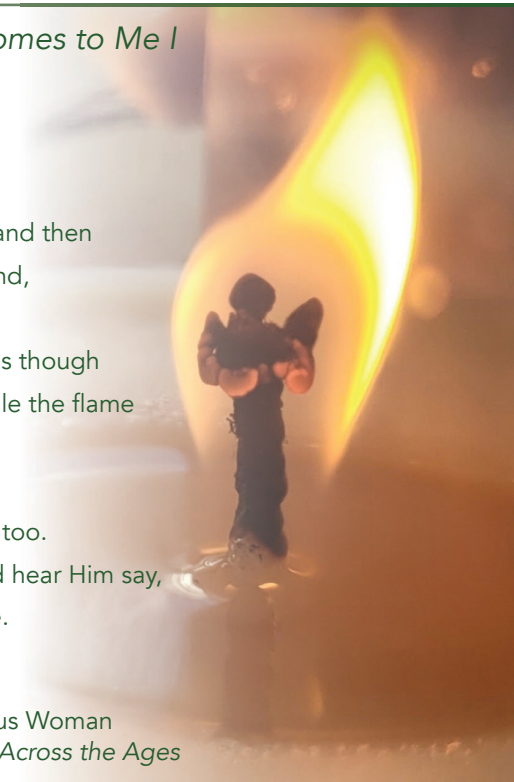
His actions spoke comfort: "I am with you in the fire."
